Broadband for Business Workshops October 18th and 25th

The Nelson & Area Economic Development Partnership (NAEDP) presents “***Broadband for Business in Nelson***” workshop and coaching program – to help businesses improve their business performance using technology enabled by broadband communications.

The program consists of:

- a 1-hour **workshop** explaining what broadband is, how companies around the world are using broadband to expand and to improve their business performance, and what broadband services and options are available in the local Nelson area; and
- The program can also provide Nelson & area businesses with a confidential **technology coaching engagement**

The ***Broadband for Business in Nelson*** workshop will be held twice at Community Futures office at 514 Vernon Street in Nelson from 12:00pm to 1:00pm on Oct 18 and 25. Pre-registration is required as seats are limited. ***There is no charge for the workshop.***

If you would like to take advantage of the **technology coaching engagement**, it will focus on your specific business circumstances and goals in a one on one session with a business technology professional who will provide recommendations on how you can best use broadband-enabled technology to improve your business performance.

For the one-on-one **technology coaching engagements**, up to 8 businesses will be selected from applicants. Businesses who attend the workshop will be given preference for the coaching engagement.

There will be a fee of \$100 for the technology coaching engagements (over \$500 value).

Why attend this program?

As broadband telecommunication has become increasingly available, inventive minds in the business world have created many new ways to use this technology to improve how business is run, to improve service to their customers, and to increase the speed and quality with which staff can perform their jobs. The NAEDP has set a strategic goal of driving technology adoption by local businesses, as we believe that broadband communication is a vital component of the future success of our region. We have created the **Broadband for Business in Nelson** program to help you discover how your business can benefit from this exciting technology.

What are Business Walks and Why Do It?

A "Business Walk" is a day dedicated to learning more about your local businesses through face face interviews on their turf.

During the Business Walks, local leaders and key community stakeholders visit a number of businesses with the hopes of gathering the knowledge they need to help their community and strengthen relationships to foster a stronger business and friendlier business climate.

The Business Walk Program will allow all of our organizations;

- Understand the issues and opportunities of our business community
- Quickly diagnose firms on the brink of greatness or that may be at risk
